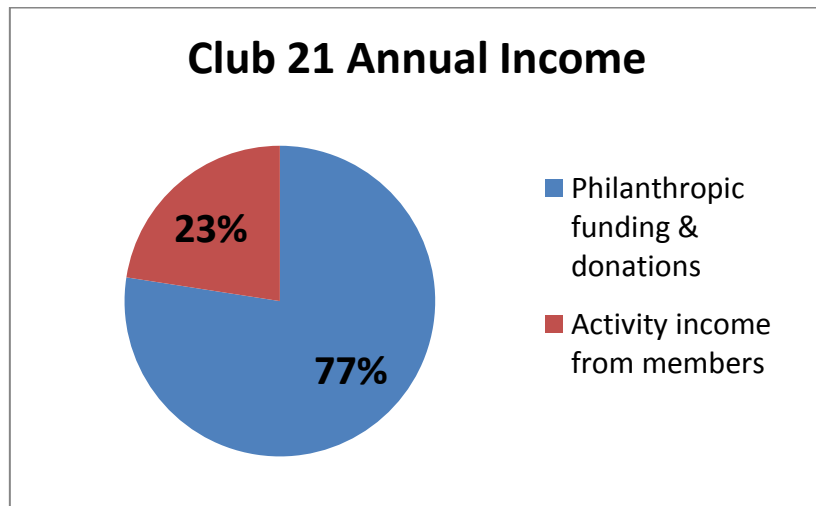


Club 21 & the NDIS

Previously, Club 21 has been subsidised by philanthropy, this support ceases in April 2018.



However, DSV is registered with the NDIS to provide Club21 activities.

With the eventual roll-out of the NDIS, Club 21 activities will only continue if Club21 members can fund the activities at NDIS rates. The more members funded for Club21 via the NDIS, the more activities DSV will be able to offer.

The best way to achieve this is to have Club 21 activities included in NDIS funded plans. To ensure that Club21 activities will be covered in an NDIS Plan it is important to discuss at planning meetings, the need for Club21 to be funded and the benefits it provides.

Managing Transition

Until the full NDIS roll-out is completed in 2019, DSV is focusing on how we can cover the inevitable funding shortfall and maintain our programme of activities as Club 21 members gradually become NDIS funded participants. At this stage, DSV will cover this shortfall and continue to charge \$22 per activity for those members waiting for NDIS to roll-out in their local area. However once individual NDIS Plans have been approved, Club 21 members can utilize their NDIS funding to continue to enjoy meeting new people, making new friends and having a whole bunch of fun at a variety of activities on offer.
